- Kill-a-Watt EZ Power Meter usage monitor for your home

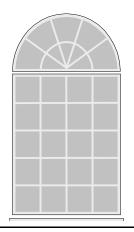


Look for the kits near the audiobooks and DVDs in the adult section.

SUMMER FLEW WITH OLD & NEW

Oh, how time flies! This summer seemed to zip right by. Now our students are back to school and we are returning to "normal."

We are thankful at JCPL for the many successes we experienced this summer. Our Kindergarten Prep School wrapped up another great year. The library and Jay School Corporation have partnered several years now to offer KiPS. Staff members and teachers, with the help of nearly 15 volunteers each week, make the engine that drives the program helping our youngest students get off on the right foot at school. Enrollment and attendance were at an all-time high with an average of 107 students attending the Tuesday morning sessions.

This year we started a pilot program aimed at students who have finished kindergarten, first or second grade and could use a little extra push to help their newly formed reading skills stay strong throughout the summer. The 17 students in this first pilot group enjoyed fun ways to stay interested in reading while using and improving their skills.

This summer also saw the introduction of wireless hotspots for loan to library cardholders. The phone-sized devices provide Internet on the go for those who may have difficulty getting high speed service at home, or who may be traveling and still need of free reliable Internet service. The demand has been high for the five hotspots currently in our collection. As demand grows, we will increase the number of hotspots available.

For those in the library building we recently upgraded our inhouse wireless network. We hope that everyone will enjoy a better wireless computing experience all over the building.
