Kindergarten Prep School is a partnership between Jay County Public Library and Jay Schools. It is a program designed to provide academic and social skills over the summer to children who will be entering kindergarten in the fall.



Any child who is eligible for kindergarten in the Jay Schools for the 2018-2019 school year may register for the program.

The program is free of charge and will be held EVERY Tuesday from 9 a.m. to noon June 5th through July 31st.

Transportation may be provided by the Jay Schools or parents can drop children off at the library.

Children spend time in small groups learning such skills as how to stand in line, raise their hands to

ask questions, participate in group

activities, and walk from one area to another. They also practice academics in math, reading, art, gym, small motor skills, and music.
