

The summer is always a busy time at JCPL and this summer proved to be no different. Our set of summer programs including the Summer Challenge is one the main centerpieces of our library year.



Here are a few of the highlights this summer -

Our Kindergarten Prep School prepared the next kindergarten class to start their school careers this fall. Around 100 children participated in this program this year. Teachers always comment that they can see a difference in children who go through this experience. It makes for some crazy Tuesday mornings in our building, but we are thankful for the opportunity to make a difference.

The No Slide Zone returned for the third summer. A group of around 20 students met on Thursday mornings and received some extra help to further build their reading skills for the next school year.

The Summer Challenge attracted 460 participants this year. With their combined reading, we were able to reach our million-page goal. As a result of reaching the goal, a donation was made to JRDS.

It took the efforts of all our staff to not only plan and carry out the nearly 50 programs that were geared to all ages but to also handle the large number of patrons in the building and their needs to check out materials and use our resources.

June and July always see the largest amount of programming activity and usage of materials and resources by our patrons. As we take a breath and regroup, we look forward to working on the next thing as we head into this fall!
