

STATE PARK PASSES NOW AVAILABLE


The Indiana State Library has partnered with the Indiana Department of Natural Resources for an exciting program for 2016. Each library in the state has been given a pass that provides free admission to any state park in the state of Indiana. Libraries have the ability to check this pass out to interested patrons. This effort is in part to celebrate Indiana's bicentennial and in part to spur interest in our state's wonderful array of state parks. So, what do you need to know about this program?



- 1. You must have a Jay County Public Library card.
- 2. The pass circulates like other items. You will have it for 7 days, so make the most of it, but return it to the library on or before the day it is due.
- 3. Overdue fines are \$1.00 per day and a lost or unreturned card will carry a \$50 replacement fee.
- 4. Reservations for the card may be made but one 7 day/1 week reservation is allowed per family at a time. After you have returned the pass you may check on the availability of another reservation.
