Monday December 12th, 6:15pm in the Community Room




For all those reasons and

Health Insurance Info & Help

Learn more about getting health care insurance at an Insurance Information Update coming Wednesday, December 14th at 10:00 am in the Community Room.

The talk is a presentation by Meridian Health Services, a notfor-profit organization that offers full body health care, accepts most insurances and also offers a sliding fee scale for those who qualify.

Following the talk, a representative will be available for oneon-one appointments until 2:00 pm to help people fill out online applications for any of the Indiana State Insurance programs or the Federal Marketplace.

To schedule an appointment call Erica at Meridian Services (765-625-1483) or drop in for any available appointments. You do not need to be a Meridian client to take advantage of this free service that answers questions about any of the Indiana state insurance programs, including HIP 2.0, Hoosier Healthwise, Medicaid, CHIP and Marketplace.

Meridian Health Services has two locations in Jay County: at 931 W. Water Street in Portland and 1150 S Main Street in Dunkirk.




CANCER REFERENCE

When you need to know more about cancer types, terms, tests, treatments and the many factors to weigh when making decisions, consider using <u>The Gale Encyclopedia of Cancer</u>.

The 2015 edition is a 3-volume set in the library's reference section. The oversized books don't circulate, but can be a place to begin tracking down the facts you need and understanding more about what you learn from medical professionals.

The reference section is on the east side of the adult area, just past the red wall. Or ask at the circulation desk.
