Learned at JCPL: To be more precise and to be patient with others.




Ashley Gomez

LONG RANGE PLANNING

The Jay County Public Library is beginning work on its next long range plan of service for the community. Our current plan, which runs from 2014 through the end of this year, saw the implementation of several new initiatives. Some of these include: the Summer Challenge, No Slide Zone, and increased programming.

We also saw the increased development of extending services outside the building: weekly visits to the Boys and Girls Club and Latchkey Programs, monthly visits to elementary classrooms, programming at local senior centers and retirement communities, and summer bookmobile service.

We certainly want to continue all of these things but also want to continue to seek new ways to serve the community. We believe that public input is valuable in this process, so we have created a brief survey included in this newsletter that we would encourage you to fill out and return to us.


