HONORING OUR WORLD WAR II VETERANS

With Veterans' Day just ahead, our thoughts are often drawn to its meaning and who it remembers. For Hoosier author, Kayleen Reusser, remembering our veterans has become her passion. Reusser has recently completed her third book in a series that highlights stories and photos of many local World War II veterans.

The veterans' stories have been compiled through personal interviews with 250 veterans, most of which are Hoosier natives or are from other places but currently reside in Indiana. Her books contain dozens of stories indicating each veteran's name, date



of birth, hometown, and branch, making it simple to locate family, friends, or neighbors that might have served. Because Reusser has a background in writing nonfiction for middle school readers, these books are a wonderful resource to bring history to life for young and old readers alike.

In addition to the time spent interviewing veterans, Kayleen and her husband recently completed a ten-day tour of Europe where they visited historical sites related to World War II including Omaha Beach, Paris, and Dachau.

On Tuesday, November 6 at 6:00 pm in the JCPL Community Room, Reusser will present a talk about her experiences interviewing these veterans and about her World War II tour through Europe. Reusser will have her books available for viewing and purchase that evening.


She is the wife of a retired U.S. Air Force airman and the mother of an airman. She says, "I wrote the books to show my support for those who have served and currently defend our country."

Did you know that the library receives shipments of new materials every week? Do you know where you can go to see what the newest additions to the library's books, movies and music are? Jay County Public Library offers several resources to stay on top of what is available.

- ♦ The JCPL website (www.jaycpl.lib.in.us) offers a "New Arrivals" tab at the top of the page. Here you can find detailed reviews of the latest materials with a link to the Evergreen system to check availability and maybe put that item on hold for yourself.
- Wowbrary is a digital service that provides you free weekly emails about your local library's most recent acquisitions of books, DVDs, and CDs. You can sign up on the website at www.wowbrary.org. A link to Wowbrary is also found on the JCPL website along with a scrolling marquee of titles.
- ♦ The JCPL Facebook page features the same scrolling feed of new weekly arrivals. See it in your newsfeed when you like us on Facebook.
- ♦ Bookpage is a monthly periodical providing readers with book reviews, author interviews, and book blogs. The most recent edition can be found at the circulation desk for no charge.
- ◆ The "New Materials" shelves, located just past the computer gallery, is the place to get your hands on those new items you're looking for. Look for the hanging sign above those shelves and check them out!.
