Hoosier author Kayleen Reusser is returning to JCPL for three events this month.

<u>Thursday, May 20 @ 6:30 p.m.</u> Those Plucky Women of World War II

A look at females who volunteered to enlist in various military branches. Their skills were needed, but not everyone believed they deserved to wear uniforms.

Monday, May 24 @ 6:30 p.m. The Longest Day- June 6, 1944

The world's largest amphibious invasion took place on June 6, 1944, when 150,000+ Allies put boots on the ground of Normandy, France, in an effort to end the war in Europe. Photos of the various beaches at Normandy are combined with quotes from veterans she has interviewed who served there.

Tuesday, May 25 @ 6:30 p.m.

Captured! Stories of American WWII Prisoners of War Kayleen's interviews with seven men who spent considerable time as captives of German and Japanese forces resulted in amazing accounts of their will to survive. This talk includes unique journal excerpts from the eighth subject, Grant Workman, who was a Bataan Death March survivor. His thoughts of racing through the Philippines jungle as a 16-yearold (he lied about his age to enlist), only to be captured and made a slave laborer in the Philippines and Japan's coal mines are riveting.
