To complete our Challenge you need to read 20 minutes a day and complete six activities, which includes a variety of fun things to do. Activity Cards can be picked up at the library or printed off at home from our website. This year we have added

When you have completed the Challenge, turn your completed form back in at the library. You will get a prize for completing the activity card and have a chance at a Grand Prize for your age group. Cards must be completed and turned in by 1:00 p.m. on July 17.

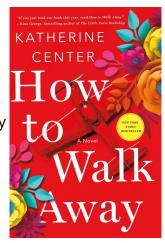

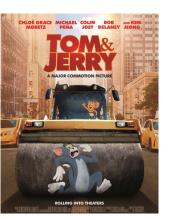
