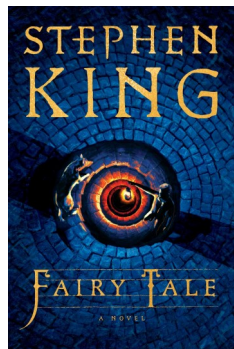

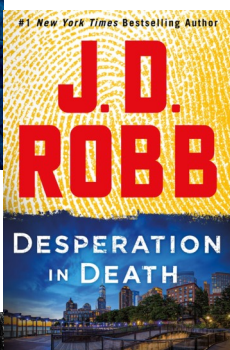


Fairy Tale– By: Stephen King

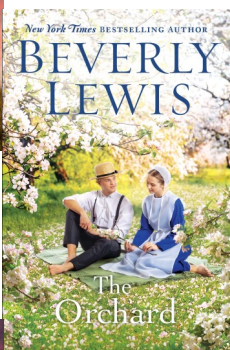


Still My Forever– By: Kim Vogel Sawyer

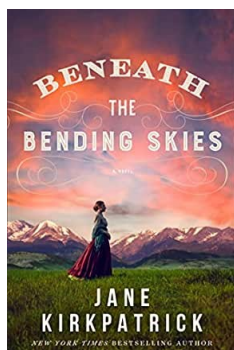


The Orchard– By: Beverly Lewis

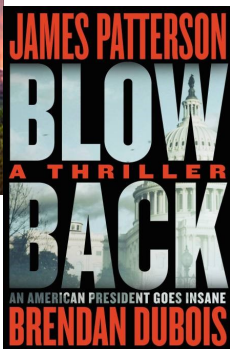


Beneath the Bending Skies– By: Jane Kirkpatrick

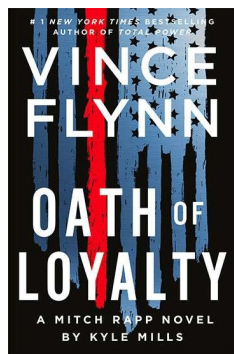
Blowback– By: James Patterson

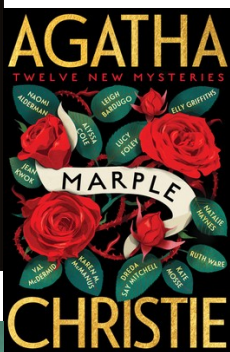


Oath of Loyalty– By: Vince Flynn (Book #21 in Mitch Rapp Series)

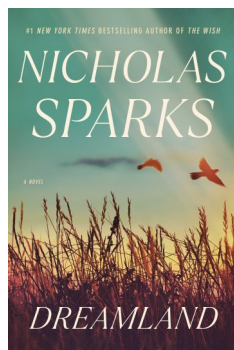


Marple: 12 New Mysteries: By Agatha Christie

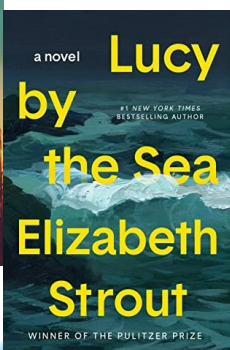


Dreamland– By: Nicholas Sparks

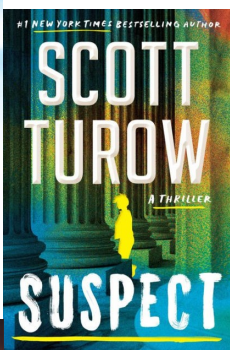


Maybe Now– By: Colleen Hoover (Book #2 in Maybe Series)

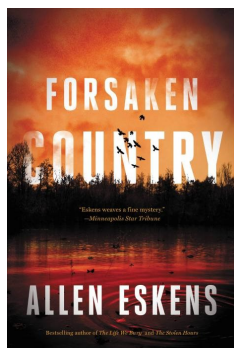


Suspect– By: Scott Turow (Book #12 in Kindle County Series)

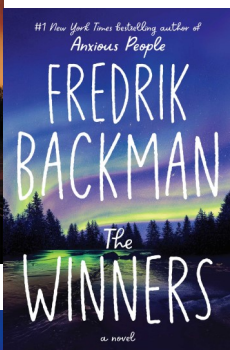


Forsaken Country– By: Allen Eskens

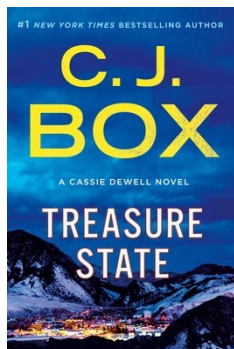


The Winners– By: Fredrik Backman (Book #3 in Beartown)

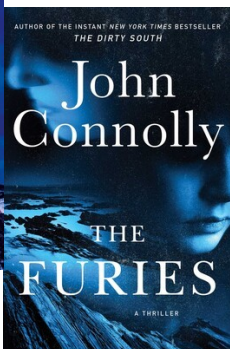


Treasure State– By: C. J. Box (Book #6 in Cody Hoyt/Cassie Dewell Series)
