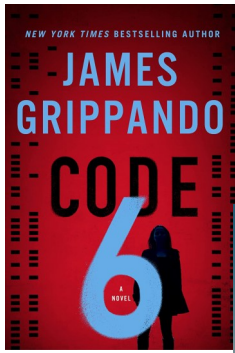

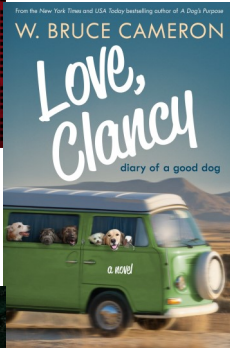


Code 6– By: James Grippando

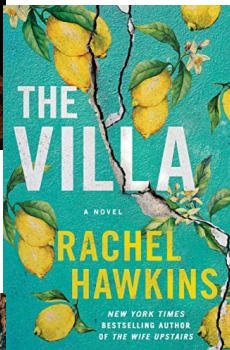


The House in the Pines– By: Ana Reyes

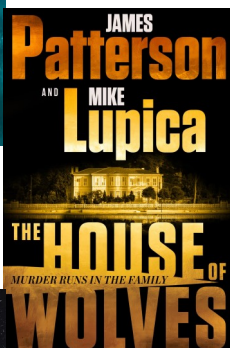


Without a Trace– By: Danielle Steel

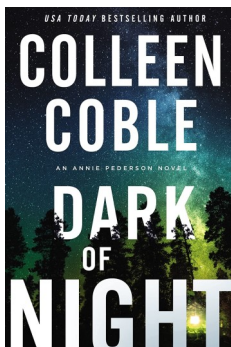


The House of Wolves– By: James Patterson

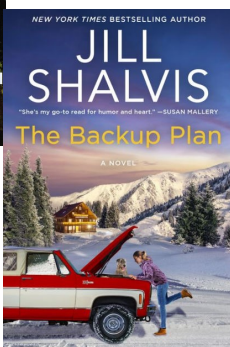


Dark of Night– By: Colleen Coble (Annie Pederson #2)

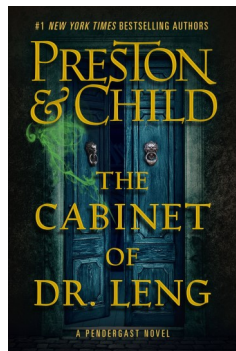
The Backup Plan– By: Jill Shalvis (Sunrise Cove #3)

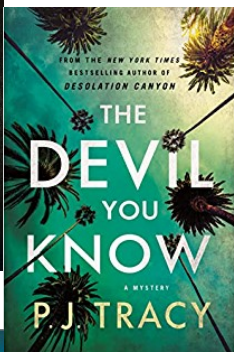


The Cabinet of Dr. Leng– By: Douglas Preston (Agent Pendergast #21)

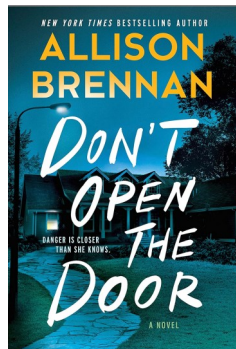


The Devil You Know– By: PJ Tracy (Detective Margaret Nolan #3)

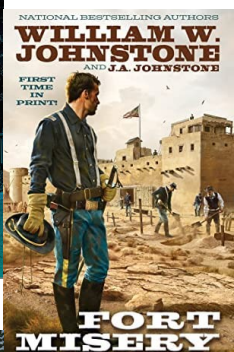


Don't Open the Door– By: Allison Brennan (Regan Merritt #2)

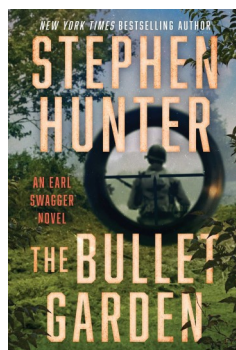


Fort Misery– By: William Johnstone

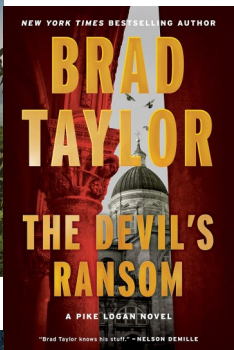
The Bullet Garden– By: Stephen Hunter (Earl Swagger #4)

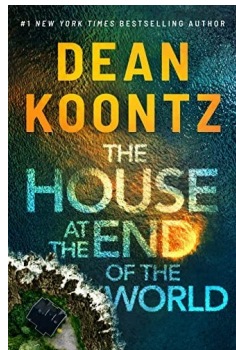


The Devil's Ransom– By: Brad Taylor (Pike Logan #17)

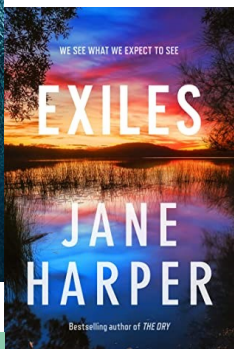


The House at the End of the World– By: Dean Koontz

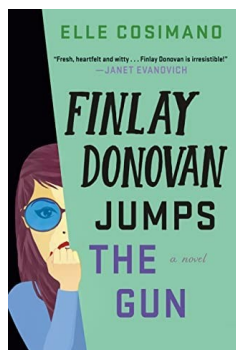


Exiles– By: Jane Harper (Aaron Falk #3)

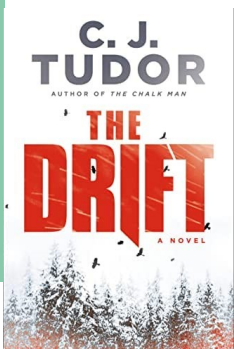


Finlay Donovan Jumps the Gun– By: Elle Cosimano (Finlay Donovan #3)
