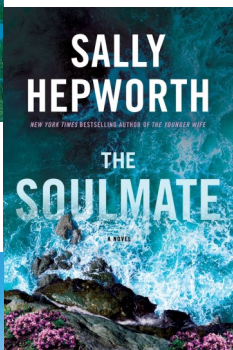


### Homecoming– By: Kate Morton

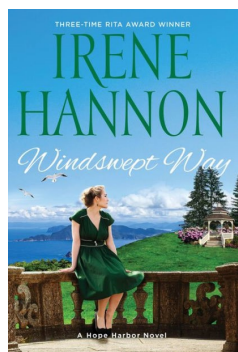


### The Soulmate– By: Sally Hepworth

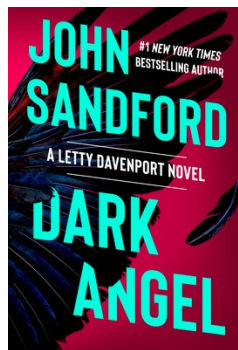


### Things I Wish I Told My Mother– By: Susan Patterson

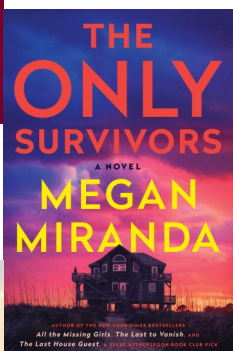


### Dark Angel– By: John Sanford (Letty Davenport #2)

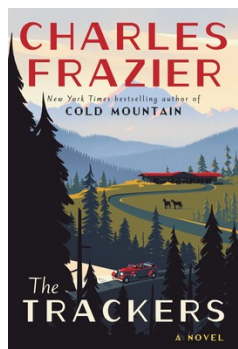


### The Only Survivors– By: Megan Miranda

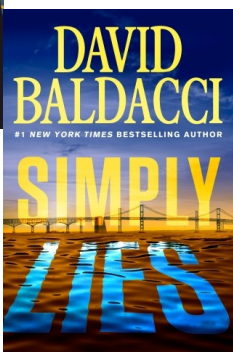


### The Trackers– By: Charles Frazier

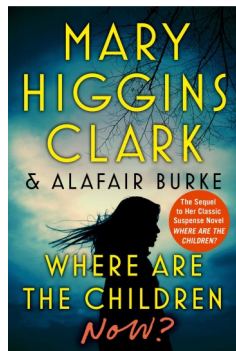
### Simply Lies– By: David Baldacci

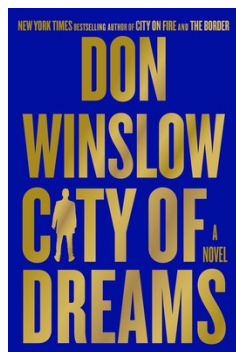

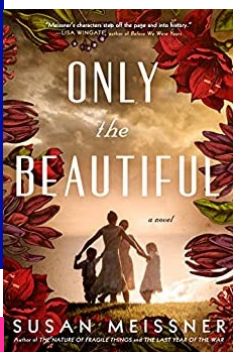
**Where Are the Children Now?- By: Mary Higgins Clark** (Where Are the Children #2)

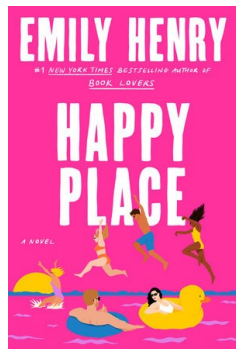
**Symphony of Secrets- By: Brendan Slocumb**

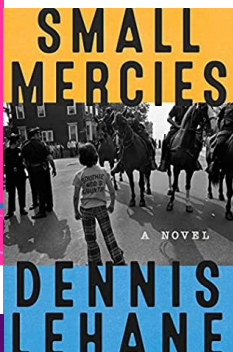
**City of Dreams- By: Don Winslow** (City #2)

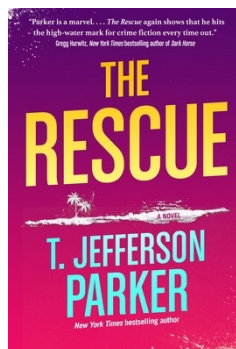

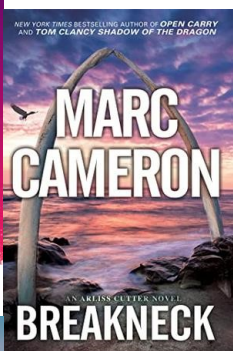

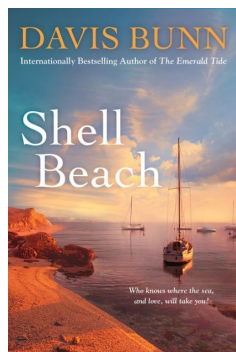
**Small Mercies- By: Dennis Lehane**

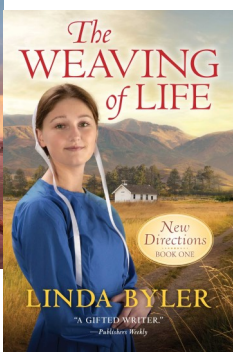
**The Rescue- By: T. Jefferson Parker**
