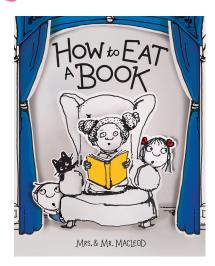
BE MY PAL-ENTINE!

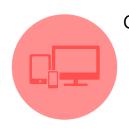
