Coloring Contest:

For three weeks this summer, JCPL will be holding coloring contests! There will be two age groups: **Ages 5-9 and Ages 10-13**. Coloring pages will be available on Mondays at the beginning of each contest week at the circulation desk. Kids must color in the page entirely. You may submit one entry per child, per contest. Winners will be contacted on the following Monday. Be sure to put your child's name, age, and phone number on the back of the page.

Week One (June 2 – June 6): Entries must be turned in by 5 p.m. on Friday, June 6. Week Two (June 30 – July 5): Entries must be turned in by 1 p.m. on Saturday, July 5. (Since the library will be closed on July 4 the contest will be extended an extra day.)
Week Three (July 14 – July 18): Entries must be turned in by 5 p.m. on Friday, July 18.

Super Start: Summer Reading Kick-off Party

Calling all superheroes of **all ages**! Library Town needs super readers for the summer and needs your help. Drop by the Community Room on **Monday, June 2 from 4-6 p.m.** to celebrate the kick-off of our summer reading program and start your training for our Superhero Reading League. Go through super hero training by choosing your name and power, practice your poses, complete feats of physical strength and agility, and make a hero mask bookmark. The mayor of Library Town will give you an official Summer Reading Tracker sheet to help you get started reading for the summer. There will also be grab-and-go super snacks available to take before you begin your summer of Super Hero Reading!

Calling all superheroes and readers! Join JCPL on a reading adventure for all ages, **June 2-July 19**! Pick up a reading log on **June 2** and color in a bubble for each 10 minutes that you read this summer. On the back of the sheet, complete at least one hero task for your superhero reading league training. Jump Rope Warrior Show

The Jay County Public Library and the Jay Community Center are excited to announce an exciting jump rope show for all ages! The Jump Rope Warrior, Inc.'s David Fisher will be performing on Thursday, June 5 at 3:30-4:15 p.m. and 5:30-6:15 p.m. at the Jay Community Center. The Rope Warrior-professional athlete/entertainer/author- is a lean, mean, jumping machine who executes stunts that most of us can't even imagine! He is the current Guinness World Record holder for the most "rump jumps" (jumping rope while sitting) in one minute: 56. Fisher's repertoire includes such techniques as: glow-in-the-dark ropes, power jumping (the rope passes under his feet up to four times per jump), jumping rope while sitting and lying, rope-jumping versions of practically any dance step, dribbling with his feet, and jumping inside a balloon—all to a background of pulsating, contemporary music. His rope speed has been timed at over 100 mph! Be there early to get your seats and be prepared for an awe-inspiring show that you won't want to miss!
